Unit Essential Question:

How does the passage of time impact your decision making?

Objective:

Describe how characters thoughts, words and actions develop the plot and explain how this contributes to the sequence of events. Analyze different character Points of View.

Anticipatory Set: Have students research the story to understand the background of this historic Danish Fairytale. Have students draw a picture of the image in their mind of Greyfoot (also known as Greylegs) based on their research.

Activities:

- Read Aloud: Students will read the story aloud. Students can be broken into small groups and given parts.
 - Have students select a character and Think, Pair Share: How did each their character assist in the development of the story through their actions?
 - Have students list the sequence of events from memory and explain the moments they selected and why?

- Character Map: Students can complete our Character Analysis & Decision Map for the character of their choosing.

Closing:

- Analyze the characters decisions with relation to the passage of time (use the character map listed in materials).
